

ST Blend Word List

Hold a long /s/ and then stop the air with the tongue tip and release it for /t/. The tongue stays in the same neighborhood the whole time.

SOUND

/st/

TYPICAL AGE

By age 5-7

TYPE

Voiceless Fricative + stop cluster

PRACTICE TIP

ST is the most common consonant cluster in English and shows up in every position - it is usually the highest-value blend to target first.

ST is practiced here at the beginning and end of words; true medial ST clusters are rare.

Initial Position (21 words)

The sound is at the beginning of the word.

The sound is at the end of the word.

High-frequency final words

Everyday words rather than picture-card words - which is why most lists leave them out. A child already says these hundreds of times a day, so they carry more carryover value than any noun above. Target them in conversation, not in drill.

next, against, least, almost, taste, fixed, kissed, chased, guessed, danced

Generalization

Word lists get a sound into a child's mouth. Generalization is what gets it into their life. These are activities where the target words come up on their own, so nobody has to be talked into practicing.

Play-based ideas for young children

Stop and go

Musical statues, or a toy that only moves on "go" and freezes on "stop."

Words that come up: stop, start, stand, still, step, again, more, go, fast, slow, my turn, wait, freeze, move

Star stickers

Star stickers to put on a chart as you play. The chart marks that the game happened, not how well it went.

Words that come up: star, sticker, stick, stack, stop, again, more, put, here, my turn, look, one more, done, wow

Stacking cups

Stack cups into a tower, then knock them down.

Words that come up: stack, stand, stop, still, steady, again, more, up, down, my turn, big, crash, tall, careful

Conversation and verbal games for older kids

Story chain

Build a story one sentence at a time. "Story" and "start" repeat.

Strangest thing

Describe the strangest thing that happened this week.
