Pronouns are shortcuts that stand in for a name once everyone knows who is being talked about. English sorts them into groups by their job in the sentence: subject pronouns do the action (he, she, they), object pronouns receive it (him, her, them), possessive pronouns show ownership (his, her, their), and reflexive pronouns point back at the subject (himself, herself, themselves).

What to expect: Children usually start with "I," "me," and "my," then add "you," then the third-person forms. Case errors ("her is running") and gender mix-ups ("he" for a girl) are both normal until about 4. Mixing up subject and object forms ("me do it," "him went") is also typical into the preschool years and generally sorts itself out without direct teaching.
