Generalization

Word lists get a sound into a child's mouth. Generalization is what gets it into their life. These are activities where the target words come up on their own, so nobody has to be talked into practicing.

Play-based ideas for young children

Feed the fish

A paper-plate fish with a mouth cut out, or a toy fish tank. Feed it, count the food, make it swim away.

Words that come up: fish, feed, food, fin, four, five, more, full, fast, swim, splash, funny, off, in

Farm animals

Line up farm animals and make their sounds. Put them in a fence, feed them, take them out again.

Words that come up: farm, fence, feed, four, fur, food, fall, fly, off, cow, funny, find, first, full

Flashlight hunt

Turn the lights off and find hidden objects with a flashlight. Let them hold the light and call out what they find.

Words that come up: find, found, flashlight, off, on, far, fast, look, funny, first, face, foot, under, fun

Conversation and verbal games for older kids

Favorite five

Name your top five in any category and defend the order. "Favorite," "first," "four," "five" and "fun" are all in play.

Fact or fiction

Make a claim; the other person guesses whether it is a fact or fiction. Both key words are targets.

Finish the story

Take turns adding a sentence to a story. "First," "finally" and "found" show up in nearly every turn.
