High-frequency final words

Generalization

Word lists get a sound into a child's mouth. Generalization is what gets it into their life. These are activities where the target words come up on their own, so nobody has to be talked into practicing.

Play-based ideas for young children

Yummy snack time

Eat something genuinely delicious and ham it up. "Mmmm" is the sound itself, so every bite is a free repetition.

Words that come up: mmm, more, yum, my, mine, mouth, milk, munch, mama, num num, some, warm, time, home

Mama and baby animals

Match baby animals to their mothers. Let the babies get lost and call for mama.

Words that come up: mama, mommy, me, my, mine, more, animal, farm, home, come, name, same, warm, time

Magnet board

Stick magnetic letters or shapes on the fridge. Name each one as it goes up, then take them down.

Words that come up: magnet, more, my turn, mine, move, make, name, same, on, off, up, room, time, come

Conversation and verbal games for older kids

Describe the best moments of a month or a summer. "My," "moment," "most" and "memory" all repeat.

Make a meal

Plan a meal from scratch, naming every ingredient and method.
