PRACTICE TIP

Have the child hold /f/ for three seconds, then "turn the motor on" without moving their mouth. That flip is the fastest way to find /v/.

Generalization

Word lists get a sound into a child's mouth. Generalization is what gets it into their life. These are activities where the target words come up on their own, so nobody has to be talked into practicing.

Play-based ideas for young children

Vroom vehicles

Drive cars, trucks and vans around a track. Add a vet visit or a delivery to the route.

Words that come up: van, vroom, drive, move, over, five, give, wave, save, love, have, above, never, cover

Vet clinic

Check stuffed animals for injuries. Listen to hearts, give check-ups, wrap bandages, send them home.

Words that come up: vet, visit, very, give, love, five, have, move, better, brave, cover, save, over, leave

Vegetable soup

Chop pretend vegetables into a pot. Taste it, add more, serve it to toys.

Words that come up: vegetable, very, have, give, more, stove, oven, move, cover, taste, love, leave, seven, over

Conversation and verbal games for older kids

Vote on it

Hold a vote about anything - best movie, worst weather. "Vote," "versus," "very" and "favorite" keep coming back.

Video review

Review a movie or a video in five sentences. "Video," "movie," "have," "give" and "every" carry it.

Travel plans

Plan a trip: where you would visit, what vehicle you would take, what you would leave behind.
