Tongue tip between the teeth exactly like voiceless TH, but turn the voice on so the tongue tickles.

PRACTICE TIP

Voiced TH shows up in the highest-frequency words in English - the, this, that, they. Fixing it changes how much of a child's speech is understood.

The sound is in the middle of the word.

High-frequency final words

Generalization

Word lists get a sound into a child's mouth. Generalization is what gets it into their life. These are activities where the target words come up on their own, so nobody has to be talked into practicing.

Play-based ideas for young children

This or that

Hold up two things and offer a choice. Either answer gives you a "this" or a "that", and "neither" is a fine answer too.

Words that come up: this, that, these, those, the, them, they, there, mother, father, brother, other, another, with

Family photo book

Look through family photos and name who is who. Mother, father and brother are the highest-frequency voiced TH words a child owns.

Words that come up: mother, father, brother, grandmother, the, this, that, them, they, there, other, together, with

Feather and breath games

Blow a feather across a table. Take turns and talk about whose turn it is.

Words that come up: feather, weather, breathe, smooth, the, this, that, they, there, together, other, than, them

Conversation and verbal games for older kids

Rather you than me

Play "would you rather" - "rather," "than," "either" and "neither" are all voiced TH and all unavoidable.

Weather report

Give a weather forecast for the week. "Weather," "whether," "the" and "there" are constant.

Then what happened

Retell an event in order. "Then," "they," "there," "this" and "that" carry every retell - which is why this sound matters so much.
