Stick the tongue tip out just barely between the teeth and blow air over the top of it.

No voice - just a quiet leak of air.

PRACTICE TIP

Let the child watch in a mirror. If they can see a sliver of tongue between their teeth and feel air on it, they have it.

Generalization

Word lists get a sound into a child's mouth. Generalization is what gets it into their life. These are activities where the target words come up on their own, so nobody has to be talked into practicing.

Play-based ideas for young children

Thumbs up game

Show things and give them a thumbs up or thumbs down. Let them judge everything in the room.

Words that come up: thumb, think, thank you, three, thin, thick, bath, tooth, math, mouth, teeth, path, both, north

Toothbrush routine

Brush a doll's teeth, then your own. Count the teeth, check the mouth, talk about what is thick or thin.

Words that come up: tooth, teeth, mouth, thumb, thick, thin, bath, thirsty, three, health, cloth, both, think, thanks

Counting to three

Use "one, two, three" to launch every activity - jumping, throwing, racing. "Three" gets said dozens of times.

Words that come up: three, thirty, think, thumb, thank you, throw, both, math, path, with, teeth, thin, thick, thud

Conversation and verbal games for older kids

Think out loud

Solve a riddle or a puzzle while narrating your thinking. "Think," "thought" and "through" repeat constantly.

Thankful three

Name three things you are thankful for and why. "Thank," "think" and "three" every single round.

Math talk

Talk through a math problem out loud. "Math," "three," "thirty," "thousand" and "both" all carry the sound.
